A note on the ancestor altar:

In general, the plan for honoring our ancestors and the beloved dead this year goes something like this:

We plan to set up a table for use as an altar. We will provide tea light candles, a libation bowl, and some typical offerings. You are

welcome to bring photos or other mementos of those you are honoring, and any unusual offerings you'd prefer (check with us if you want to know specifically what we'll have).

As people feel inspired, they will go to the altar throughout the evening, light a candle or candles in honor of their ancestors, leave offerings, do any ritual sort of stuff they desire, and so on.

Or you can just enjoy looking at the pretty candles in the dark—no one is required to participate.
